

HTML TAG	FUNCTION
<!DOCTYPE html>	defines what version of HTML the page is written in—must be the first thing in your html document
<html>	contains the entire html document

HEAD

<head>	contains the head of the html document
<meta />	provides general information about the document
<title>	title of the document
<link>	used to link to style sheets
<script>	scripting language

TABLES

<table>	table
<tr>	table row
<th>	table header
<td>	table data

HTML TAG	FUNCTION
BODY	
<body>	contains the body of the html document
<div>	generic container used for anything
<header>	contains intro content (can contain anything except another header or footer)
<footer>	footer that appears at the bottom of a page or a section, and cannot contain another header or footer
<article>	contains sections of content, or can stand alone
<section>	groups related content together, typically each section would get its own header (can be nested inside an article)
<aside>	when inside an article it can be used to contain information about an article— when outside an article it can be used as a container for information that is related to an entire page (i.e. side bar)
<nav>	contains major navigational elements (used by screen readers to identify main navigation)
<figure>	contains any content that is referenced from an article (mainly images and graphs)

	unordered list (bullets)
	ordered list (numbers)
	list item
<a>	anchor or link

<p>	paragraph
<h1>	heading level 1
<h2>	heading level 2
<h3>	heading level 3
<h4>	heading level 4
<h5>	heading level 5
<h6>	heading level 6
	emphasis (usually italic)
	strong emphasis (usually bold)
<ins>	underlined
<code>	code sample
<cite>	a citation
<blockquote>	long quotes or citations
<small>	small text
	strike through text
	applies an attribute to any snippet of content
<hr />	horizontal rule
 	line break
<!-- ... -->	creates a comment (hidden from the browser)

href=“...”	URL of linked document
src=“...”	URL of image
target=“...”	the window or location in which to open the link
alt=“...”	alternate text when browser cannot support images
id=“...”	element id
class=“...”	element class
align=“...”	horizontal alignment of the contents of the cell
height=“...”	height in pixels
width=“...”	width in pixels
border=“...”	width of the border in pixels
background=“...”	background image
cellspacing=“...”	spacing between cells

style=“...”	allows you to add inline css styles
